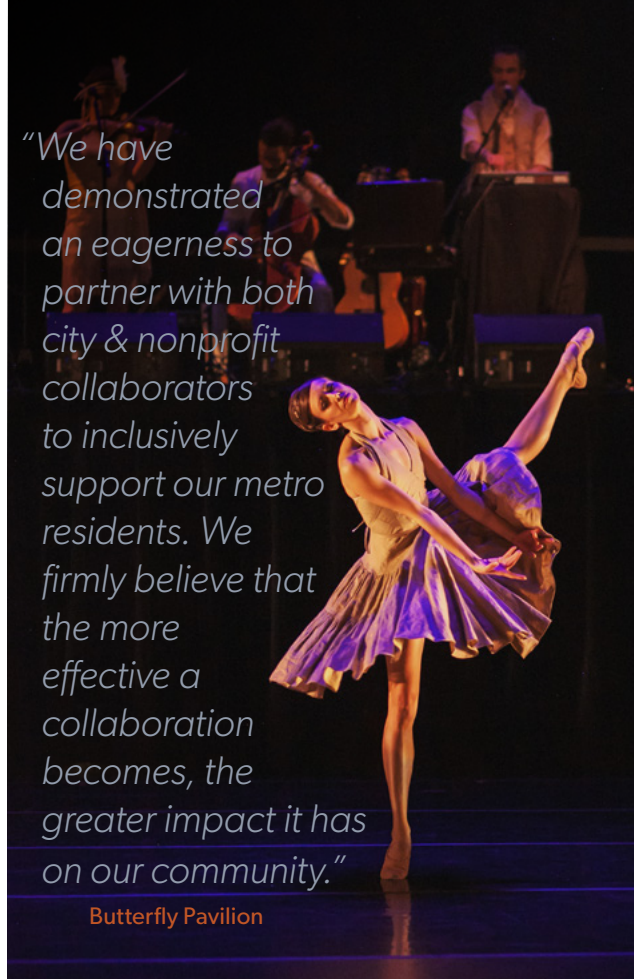


Collaboration

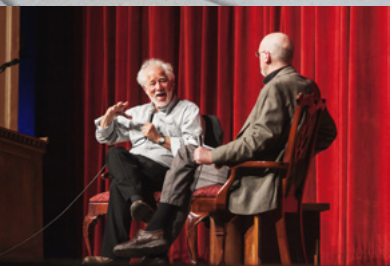
Tier 3 | Grantees
