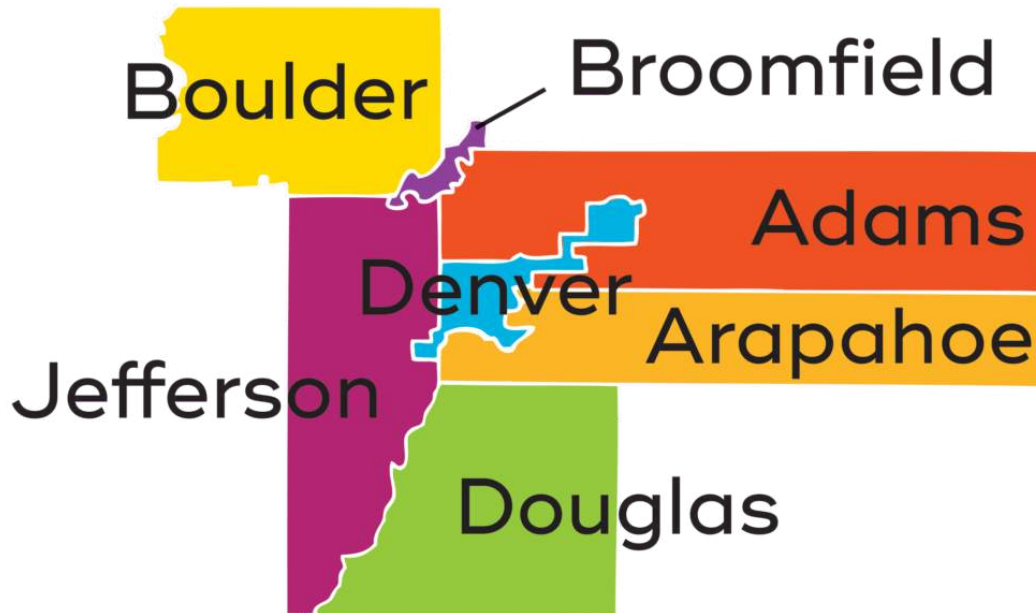

# A TINY TAX THAT DOES BIG THINGS



SCFD is the Scientific and Cultural Facilities District, a tax collected and distributed to nearly 300 cultural organizations in our seven-county Denver metro region including Adams, Arapahoe, Boulder, Broomfield, Denver, Douglas and Jefferson counties.

Just one penny on every \$10 spent in the district creates vibrancy for us individually and collectively. It gives our kids a unique perspective and understanding of the world. It inspires all of us to get off the couch, discover the radical and the beautiful, and stretches our capacity to be transformed. Our metro area would not be the vibrant, nationally-ranked metropolis that it is today, without the cultural funding and economic impact created by SCFD. Residents understand this and have approved continuing the tax at each of three renewal elections.

With over \$60 million granted annually, our community is enriched by an amazing tapestry of culture that is available and accessible to everyone. Beginning with taxpayers and with the expert shepherding of the SCFD, our collective mission is simple: We fund culture.

## MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIR & THE DIRECTOR

In 2019, the SCFD enjoyed unprecedented growth and stability. As always, that reality was reflected in the funding we delivered to our nearly 300 supported organizations and the impact we made on the Denver metro economy.

SCFD generated \$66.1 million in funding for arts, culture, and science across the seven-county region, the largest in the history of the district, allowing us to contribute even more to the cultural ecosystem that underpins the lives and the economy of the counties and cities we serve. This year, we moved more fully into our new, forward-looking brand, engaging the public more robustly on digital spaces that lets them see and interact with the diverse range of organizations we support. Our increased funding allows us to expand our support to our state's many cultural gems while also growing our ability to help individual counties fulfill their goals for arts and culture in their communities.

In 2019, SCFD also worked to diversify its Board of Directors, bringing on members who more fully reflect the broad range of lived experience of our region. As it has for 30 years, the board continues to play a pivotal role in overseeing the public's investment and safeguarding the public's trust. While 2019 strengthened the cultural fabric of our region, we have entered uncertain times in 2020. The realities of the global pandemic and its specific impact on the ability of arts and culture has been dramatic. Stages are dark. Concerts are virtual. Gatherings are limited. It is in this moment that the SCFD is most needed, continuing to provide the lifeblood of funding to the broad array of local experiences and world-class offerings that has been our reason for existence for more than three decades. In these uncertain times, SCFD will continue to support the wonder we all need in our lives and advocate for a healthy recovery for our cultural community.

## **WE FUND CULTURE**

SCFD collected and distributed \$66.1 million in 2019, the largest total in the district's 30-year history. This funding allows the district to grow its support of the broad and diverse array of cultural offerings from small local theater to world-class visual art to internationally important scientific exploration and education. The public has consistently supported the district's continued work, and the district has repaid that support by, in turn, funding the wonder they need and the organizations they love.

## **GROWING OUR IMPACT**

As a major force within the cultural landscape, SCFD works to cultivate strong relationships with our elected officials nurturing a greater understanding of and appreciation for the district's contributions. Our 2019 day at the Colorado State Capitol included a gubernatorial proclamation honoring the district's achievements as well as legislative recognition of the district's contributions to our region. The Capitol was filled with the sights, sounds, and performances of art, culture, and science.

## **REFLECTING OUR COMMUNITIES**

Increased funding for the district means increased support to the seven counties that make up the SCFD including Adams, Arapahoe, Boulder, Broomfield, Denver, Douglas, and Jefferson counties. This support allows County Cultural Councils, appointed by local County Commissioners and City Councils to explore their vision more fully for their own cultural future. SCFD supports hundreds of small, local organizations funded at the county level and serving neighborhoods and communities as an integral part of the social fabric.
