We have already seen larger events canceled in Colorado as companies continue to restrict non-essential travel in hopes of protecting their employees.

- <u>The Centers for Disease Control are aggregating all available data and information</u> about the spread of the virus and helpful tools for preparing, as well as <u>specific</u> <u>information for businesses and employers.</u> Additionally, the CDC has published helpful information for <u>stemming any potential spread in various parts of our community.</u>
- The Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment, the state agency coordinating the Colorado response to the virus threat, <u>has aggregated state information</u>.
- Many public health offices in the seven-county metro area have also established county-specific information sites including <u>Adams</u>, <u>Arapahoe</u>, <u>Boulder</u>, <u>Broomfield</u>, <u>Denver</u>, <u>Douglas</u> and <u>Jefferson</u> counties.
