connection which provides access to resources and develops programs and platforms that support, advance, and strengthen visibility for Japanese artists and culture in America. As a professional taiko musician with close to 30 years of experience, she has performed across the globe in Dubai, as well as in major cities throughout the United States. Courtney was appointed by Gov. Jared Polis

and her first term expires in May 2024.

The SCFD is governed by an 11-member board which includes one representative from each of the seven counties appointed by the board of county commissioners or city council that participate in the SCFD as well as four members appointed by Colorado's governor. The board of directors reviews and oversees all funding distribution from the district.
